A Year Dominated by the impact of the Covid Pandemic

The situation in Thailand has deteriorated throughout the year. With very low levels of vaccination the virus has spread rapidly and government schools have been shut since March.

The impact on the migrant population has been devastating. With collapse of the tourist industry and factories closing many migrants have lost their jobs. One Sky's research shows that some families are living on around 70 pence per day per person. This is well below the World Bank calculation of the poverty line in Thailand of £3.70 per day. One Sky has had to priorities the welfare and health of the children with many more families needing monthly food drops to feed their children.

The year ahead 2021/22

We are anticipating that when schools reopen there will be even more families needing support to send their children back to school.

We are budgeting to provide support to 300 children to ensure as many as possible do not drop out of school and loose the opportunity of an education which can transform their lives.

We were able to welcome back many of our supporters to our annual garden party in August. After missing out due to lockdown last year everyone enjoyed the entertainment by Gentle Jazz while raising a record £2330. News from the field



Rung coordinates One Sky's food welfare program:

How many families are on the monthly food drop each month?

On average, 50 families per month but were unequal every month because they had more help during the month and it was short-term in some families who need help only when they can't cut the rubber, causing no income.

What do you provide for the families?

Rice, eggs and oil by considering the needs of each family and the number of family members especially the members who are children

Do you stop and talk with the families? What do you talk about?

I talk to these families every time that I delivers food to ask about their well-being, their work and education of their children in the families.

Why is the monthly food drop important for these families?

Although food assistance will not help families to take care of themselves in the long term but it alleviated the hardships of the family for a while to give them a time to find work in order to earn money and solve family problems. Especially with children that should not be in a difficult situation that will affect their health and development.

Care reform in Thailand





The system of care for children in Thailand remains largely unregulated and reliant on an institutional approach that is now seen as harmful to children in many other countries.

Alternative Care Thailand (ACT) is a coalition of likeminded organisations and professionals working together to both push and support the Thai government with the reform of the care system for all children in Thailand.

One Sky is one of the leading members of ACT and CARA is fully behind this effort to bring about long-term improvements for all children and families in need of support.

In November ACT partnered with the Department for Children and Youth (DCY) and UNICEF Thailand to host a breakthrough (online) conference for almost 500 key personnel. (see poster above).

The conference ended with a ministerial statement pledging commitment to reduce the reliance on institutional types of care and to increase the support available for families and also family-based care (such as foster care) when needed.

This was a huge moment for everyone involved with ACT we commend their commitment over the last 6 years to have reached this point. We look forward to hearing more as all those involved begin the long road towards reform of the care system.
